look with wicker chairs and sofas covered in poppy-printed fabric and plain colors of blue and deep yellow.

The ladies' locker room has an oyster shower room with glass-doored shower stalls. Dressing rooms and a valet chamber adjoin. This area opens onto a court leading to cart and bag storage and the pro shop.

AT THE FAR end of this level are dressing rooms for the pool for teens, sub-teens and the life guards.

The west end of the first floor is devoted to men's lockers. This area has a tawny carpet and gold walls with a corner card area furnished with wooden director's chairs and round tables of light wood.

The shower room includes a sauna.

The passageway to the men's bar has brown textured walls and slanting skylights. A round window frames a view of the golf course.

The men's grill has a tawny carpet and

barnboard and white brick walls. Chairs are black leather with pale wood, and a lounge arrangement is upholstered in golds and browns and brown tweed.

The main lounge is carpeted in charcoal with deep gray and purple walls, purple chairs and a banquette of tapestry fabric. The huge windows look out on the golf course.

The sunken dining room is carpeted in brilliant green with black tables and zebra-patterned chairs. The sculptural round holes are seen to advantage from the room.

An open veranda passes the men's grill and two sides of the dining room. The east windows of the dining room look out on the pool.

The kitchen is an angled work area filled with the latest stainless steel equipment.

Manager for the club is Ron Ameche, who formerly worked at Elmcrest Country Club, Cedar Rapids, and Plumtree National Golf Club, Harvard, Ill.

lon cane-back chairs upholstered in brick, barbery oak and oiled walnut tables and antique jonquil upholstered pieces.

HAND-HOOKED tapestries are part of the decor, and lamps have hemp shades. Solid chairs seem lighter with cane touches.

Waterman says, "We'll be pretty much shut down until March 1 when the new manager comes. He will get things ready to open the club from April 1 to Dec. 31."

The manager is Charles Holmes who lives in Maquoketa and formerly managed country clubs at Wilton and Clinton.

"We think the clubhouse is functional and not overdone," Waterman says.

Last year's dues were \$1,000 initiation fee for an equity membership and \$480 per year. The board has not yet determined the 1971 dues.
